Career Brief:

Dr. Hofferth is Professor, Department of Family Science, University of Maryland at College Park and Associate Director, Maryland Population Research Center. Dr. Hofferth received her Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of North Carolina in 1976. From 1983 to 1988 Hofferth served as Health Scientist Administrator in the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development. From 1977 to 1983 and from 1988 to 1994 she was Research Associate and then Senior Research Associate at the Urban Institute in Washington, DC, where she directed the National Child Care Survey 1990 and collaborated on A Profile of Child Care Settings. From 1994 to 2001 she was Senior Research Scientist at the Institute for Social Research of the University of Michigan where she co-directed the Michigan Panel Study of Income Dynamics and directed its Child Development Supplement. Hofferth has researched family issues in the context of public policy for more than 30 years. In 1991-92 she was awarded the Jensen Lectureship, jointly sponsored by the American Sociological Association and Duke University, for research contributing to the goal of providing social action with a more rational grounding in tested knowledge. In 2005 she was awarded the Research and Development Award for the College of Health and Human Performance, University of Maryland. She has served on the Policy Council of the Association for Public Policy Analysis and Management, on the Board of the Population Association of America, and as Chair of the American Sociological Association's Sociology of Children Section. She has published 3 books and more than 90 articles and book chapters. She is currently coinvestigator on a program project funded by NICHD that is examining the Transition to Fatherhood.
