V.C.1. Major Programs Established

I developed a sexual health and reproductive epidemiology (SHARE) research group consisting of advanced doctoral students and post-doctoral mentees. The purpose is to encourage collaboration within the discipline, as well as across disciplines within the School of Public Health. Additionally, the goal is to increase productivity for our doctoral students and post-doctoral mentees. The group currently consists of 8 students and 4 faculty across disciplines within the SPH and outside the SPH (e.g. Anthropology and Psychology).

I redesigned EPIB/HLTH301 (Epidemiology for Public Health Practice). This course evolved from a small, intimate classroom setting of 18 in the Fall of 2015 to a class size of 233 in Spring 2019. The redesign included case-based learning in efforts to reinforce course material in a more interactive manner, as well as clicker-type quiz questions throughout the lectures to engage students in applying their current knowledge to problem-solving epidemiologic "problems."
